



While some of the raw materials that the Harappans used were available locally many items such as copper, tin, gold, silver and precious stones had to be brought from distant places.</p> <p>2.The Harappans probably got copper from Rajasthan and even from Oman.</p> <p>3. Tin, which was mixed with copper to produce bronze, may have been brought from Afghanistan and Iran.</p> <p>4.Gold could have come all the way from Karnataka.</p> <p>5. Precious stones from Gujarat, Iran and Afghanistan.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">OR</p> <p>There were many reasons for the decline of the Harappan Civilization:</p> <p>1. The Harappan civilization suddenly seems to have started to end, around 3900 years ago. People stopped living in many cities. Writing, seals and weights became 'extinct'. Raw materials were now rarely imported.</p> <p>2. Some scholars suggest that this happened due to the drying of rivers.</p> <p>3. Some others have explained it with deforestation. This could have happened because grazing by large herds of cattle, sheep and goat may have destroyed the green cover.</p> <p>4. In some areas there were floods. The floods could have been a reason for the end.</p>	5

		5. Rulers might also have lost control. Consequently, People abandoned sites in Sind and Punjab and moved to newer, smaller settlements to the east and the south.
